What is Telecommunications in South Sudan?

What is Sudan Radio Service?

Sudan Radio Service is a shortwave broadcaster based in Nairobi, but since it established an FM station in Juba in 2010, most of its program making has been transferred to South Sudan.

Does South Sudan have a good internet connection?

South Sudan is lagging behind in the expansion of broadband internet connections. Around 12 percent of all residents have access to the internet. Around 0 percent have their own fast internet connection, which is at least faster than the former ISDN (more than 256 kbit/s).

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Is South Sudan lagging behind in telecommunications development?

Compared to the United States, South Sudan is massively lagging behind in the development of telecommunications. Under the country code +211, there were a total of 6.17 million connections in 2023. Among them were 6.17 million mobile phones, which corresponds to an average of 0.54 per person. In the US, this figure is 1.2 mobile phones per person.
