In the modern world, most nations attempt to minimize the risk of war caused by miscommunication or inadequate communication. As a result, military communication is intense and complicated and often motivates the development of advanced technology for remote systems such as satellites.

Which technology is needed to develop military communications systems?

The armed forces have the responsibility for sovereignty and territorial integrity. Thus, it is necessary to tend to technological sovereignty with the capacity of developing its own military technology. In this context, an enabling technology for developing military communications systems is software-defined radio (SDR) [2].

Why are radios important in military communication?



Radios have played a major role in military communication. Since they are capable of sending radio waves to transmit voice signals over long distances. This can be helpful for communication on the battlefield since it is a good way to send messages undetected over long distances.

What does a military radio program do?

Establish programs to create civilian interest, recruit the best qualified amateur radio volunteers, and provide training in military communications, techniques, and procedures. Improve HF and very high frequency (VHF) radio operating techniques and technology through training, experimentation, and testing.



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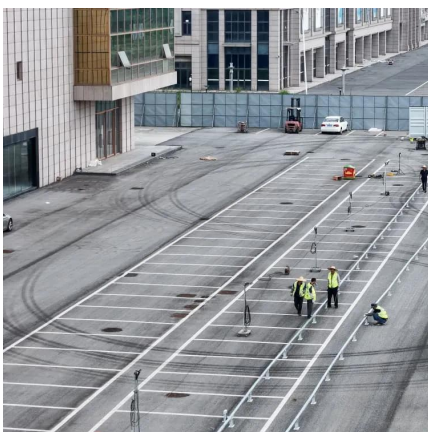
