Overview

How much does residential electricity cost in Georgia?

Average monthly residential electricity bills in the U.S. range from approximately \$75 to \$203. Residential electricity rates in Georgia average 11.17¢/kWh, which ranks the state 29th in the nation. The average residential electricity rate of 11.17¢/kWh in GA is 5.98% less than the national average residential rate of 11.88¢/kWh.

What is the average electricity rate in Georgia?

Georgia ranks 20th in average electricity rates in the United States based on the average rates for all sectors from the Energy Information Administration. Here's how the individual sectors of California's energy market stack up. The average Georgia residential electricity rate is 14.84 ¢/kWh (14% lower than the national average).

What is the average energy loss for electricity providers in Georgia?

The average energy loss for electricity providers in Georgia is 3.84%. This includes data from 57 suppliers, including Georgia Power, Jackson EMC, and Cobb Electric Membership Corp. With a nationwide average of 2.43%, Georgia is ranked as the 36th best state in the United States.

What fuel is used for electricity in Georgia?

The main fuel source used for electricity generation in Georgia is Natural Gas, making up 40.16% of the fuel used in the state. Nuclear and Coal also account for 34.41% and 13.31% respectively. How much does electricity cost in Georgia?

The average cost per kilowatt hour of electricity in Georgia in 2025 is 14.42 cents.

No, the state has a regulated market, where citizens' electricity supplier options are often determined by their location or state legislation.

What is the average monthly industrial electricity bill in Georgia?

The average monthly industrial electricity bill in Georgia is \$8,972, which ranks 24th in the nation. This average monthly industrial electricity bill in Georgia is 19.9% greater than the national average monthly bill of \$7,483. Average monthly industrial electricity bills in the U.S. range from approximately \$1,285 to \$993,225.
